1. About the Graduate Certificate of Global Project Management

The Graduate Certificate of Global Project Management (GCGPM21) is an introductory nested course within the MGPM and MGPMA. The GCGPM will introduce students to, or upskill project management abilities, to become part of a project management team and further their project management career. Graduates will gain a foundation in project management theory, with a knowledge of both traditional and agile methodologies and how to apply them in real workplace contexts. The course will assist students to build confidence and technical expertise, as well as developing greater capability to deal with the management challenges of a variety of projects. The graduate of this course will be able to demonstrate the value of clear communication and comprehensive planning, equipping students with a practical toolbox of skills and strategies that can be applied in diverse situations.

Completing the Graduate Certificate of Global Project Management is a pathway to further study and professional career development with a Graduate Diploma of Project Management and the Masters of Global Project Management.

The GCGPM course will be facilitated via on-campus and online classes to allow students increased flexibility to meet the needs of the working professional and be immediately applicable to their current job and/or future career.

5. Advanced standing/academic credit/recognition of prior learning (RPL)

You may be entitled to credit for prior learning, whether formal or informal. Formal learning can include previous study in higher education, vocational education, or adult and community education. Informal learning can include on the job learning or various kinds of work and life experience. Credit can reduce the amount of study needed to complete a degree.

Applicants admitted based on prior higher education study may be eligible for Advanced Standing in the form of credit and/or recognition of prior learning (RPL) under the Torrens University Australia [Credit Policy - \(https://www.torrens.edu.au/policies-and-forms\)](https://www.torrens.edu.au/policies-and-forms).

- Students with completed subjects may be eligible for specified credit and/or elective exemptions
- Students who have completed a qualification at AQF level 5 (diploma) or above may be eligible for block credit (where a block credit agreement exists)
- Students with a mix of formal study and informal and/or non-formal learning may be eligible for recognition of prior learning in addition to any credit approved.

Credit will not be applied automatically. Applicants must apply for credit and/or RPL as early as possible prior to each study period, with applications not accepted after week 2.

7. Additional Information

Course Structure

The GCGPM21 course structure comprises four (4) subjects (40 credit points). The course of study is made up of:

- *Core subjects*: There are two (2) core subjects (20 credit points)
- *Elective subjects*: There are two (2) electives (20 credit points)

Course Rules

To qualify for the award of Graduate Certificate of Global Project Management, the candidate must satisfactorily complete a course of study comprising two (2) core subjects (20 credit points) and two (2) elective subjects (20 credit points). A combined total of 40 credit points is required. At least one

elective must be taken from the Project Management Elective Bank, with the other elective from either of the approved Elective Banks below (if the subject has not already been taken) or any postgraduate subjects (AQF 8 and / or AQF 9) with prior approval from the Program Director.

Subject Descriptors
<p>1. PROJ6000 – Principles of Project Management</p> <p>This subject introduces you to the practice of contemporary project management and its relevance in industry. You will be introduced to fundamental concepts of project management, project definition and project delivery methods. Contemporary project management methodologies will be examined in the context of industry best practice. An overview of industry standard tools and techniques required to manage projects successfully throughout a project life cycle will be provided. This includes industry terminology and the rationale behind the commencement of a project.</p>
<p>2. PROJ6002 – Project Planning and Budgeting</p> <p>Understanding the relationships between operational factors and projects is a core skill to be effective in the project management landscape. This subject focuses on an in-depth understanding in project planning and budgeting. The project planning emphasises developing effective management plans for scope, time, cost, resources and quality to deliver successful projects. You will critically analyse and apply appropriate tools, techniques, processes and methods to create different plans and effectively communicate them to diverse groups of stakeholders.</p>
